

## **Indo-European, Greek and Latin: Morphology (Prof. A. Willi)**

Together with the Phonology lectures beginning in week 1, these are the core lectures for the philology subject in Classics Mods and the joint schools including Classics, and for the 'Comparative Philology: Indo-European, Greek and Latin' paper in Greats and in the joint schools including Classics. They also form part of the teaching for the comparative philology papers in the taught graduate courses in Classics. Other interested people are very welcome.

These lectures aim to introduce the morphological history of Greek and Latin and the grammatical structure of their reconstructed ancestor, Proto-Indo-European. Basic knowledge of either Latin or ancient Greek (or both) is helpful; those taking Mods IB, IC, IIA, or IIB will be at no disadvantage.

Handouts will be provided and students will be encouraged, if they so wish, to do some exercises; these offer an opportunity for practice and reinforcement of new material and concepts.

This series of lectures will continue into the first half of next term (please check next term's lecture list in due course for details of time and place), and will be repeated next year.
